The Lamson Collection

The **Lamson Collection** consists of two distinct parts. The first is referred to as the **Lamson Papers**. The second part consists of the **Lamson Books**.

The **Lamson Papers**, consisting of Genealogical Papers & Newspapers & Publications, are stored under Piscataqua Pioneers Papers, 1905-1997, MC231, Milne Special Collections and Archives, University of New Hampshire Library, Durham, NH, USA. It is under the management of Bill Ross, Special Collections Librarian. Contact information about the Special Collections staff can be <u>found here</u>.

The collection is divided into four series: Series 1 & 2 are alphabetical, while Series 3 is sorted by material type and Series 4 is chronological.

- Series 2 Piscataqua Pioneer Member created Genealogies
- Series 3 Piscataqua Member Created Booklets and Pamphlets
- Series 4 Society Information and Secretary Minutes, 1905-1997

Sections of this Collection have restrictions:

Membership applications & files (Series 1) as well as secretary's minutes (Series 4) are open only to members of the Society of Piscataqua Pioneers. A member needs to request materials 48 hours in advance and show both a photo ID and a Piscataqua Pioneers membership card.

This collection is housed in the Library Storage Building; access requires 48 hours notice. Please contact the Special Collections staff prior to visiting the library.

The Lamson Books

The **Lamson Books**, numbering more than 400, have been integrated into the books in the Milne Special Collections and Archives and can be readily accessed by everyone. They have been entered in the Dimond Library online catalog and can be searched either from home or when visiting the Special Collections and Archives using the online catalog.

There are member-donated publications of interest to Piscataqua area researchers which include many town histories, many surname books, a complete set of the *New Hampshire State Papers*, an alphabetical listing of *Flagg's Maine Revolutionary War Pensioners living in Maine*, and many other books too numerous to list here. Each book has a Piscataqua Pioneers Lamson Collection Bookplate.
